TURF TYPE TALL FESCUE

Turf Type Tall Fescue is a cool season, bunching grass, with coarse to medium texture. A 90/10 mix of turf type fescue and Kentucky Bluegrass makes this an ideal choice. It has a dense root system and therefore a great tolerance to drought conditions. This mix will handle summer stress well but is slow to recover if heavy injury occurs.

ORNAMENTAL GRASS



This grass forms an upright and fairly narrow clump of feathery plumes, beginning in early fall. Flower heads start out silvery-pink, fading to more of a creamy-white tone and remaining attractive for most of the winter.
Height 24-40"
Spread 12-15"
Full Sun to Partial Shade
USDA Zone 4 - 9



Calamagrostis brachytricha
 Feather Reed Grass, 'Korean'



Selected as Perennial Plant of the Year for 2001. Remains attractive for months on end, and is not invasive. Clumps are strongly upright, with dark green leaves. Feathery green plumes appear in summer, maturing into stiff wheat-coloured spikes.

Calamagrostis acutiflora 'Karl Foerster'
 Feather Reed Grass, 'Karl Foerster'



There are several selections of Blue Fescue, all of them valued for their clumping habit, and display of colorful, grassy foliage. This is considered to be one of the best blue selections, retaining its color all season. Tan spikes appear in early summer.

Plants form a well-behaved clump of bright silvery-blue leaves, with taller arching stems of flowers appearing in early summer. Non-spreading in habit, this will remain evergreen in mild winter regions.

A return to the American tall grass prairie. It is a clump forming, fine textured grass. An ideal grass for managed meadows, it is tolerant of varying moisture conditions.

Blonde Ambition blue grama grass (Bouteloua gracilis 'Blonde Ambition' PPAF) is a first of its kind, highly ornamental selection of Western native grass with tall, upright stems. Blooming July to October, it prefers dry soils, and tolerates a wide range of soil types.

Plants form an upright clump of darkgreen leaves, turning flame-orange and bronze in the autumn, particularly in warm regions. Tall spikes of very soft-pink flowers develop into silvery plumes that stay effective all winter long.

Miscanthus sinensis 'Purpurascens'
 Flame Grass



This selection forms a tall, arching clump of green leaves, bearing airy heads of tiny green flowers in late summer. Fall color is a vibrant burgundy-red.

Panicum virgatum 'Rotstrahlbusch'
 Red Switch Grass



This selection forms an upright clump of arching green leaves, bearing bottlebrush spikes of silvery-white flowers that turn to buff or tan as they dry. Plants usually remain attractive well into the winter, the leaves turning bright golden-yellow in the fall.

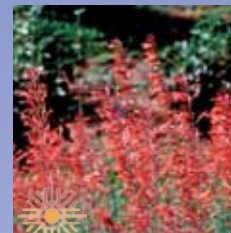
Pennisetum alopecuroides 'Hameln'

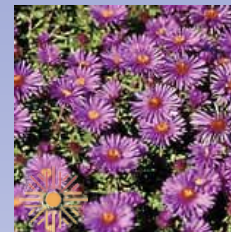
PERENNIAL

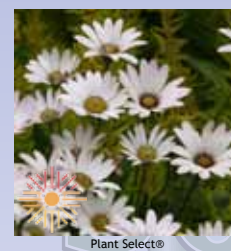
Agastache rupestris

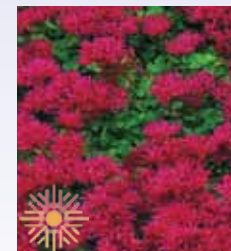
